The Tiedemann Mill was a 19th century testament of O'Fallon's roots until it burned down Nov. 11, 1972. The fire started Sat afternoon and wasn't brought under control until late Saturday evening. Eighty firefighters responded from O'Fallon, Fairview Heights, Lebanon, East Side, Belleville, French Village and Signal Hill. 1.5 million gallons were used to fight the fire. O'Fallon: adopted charter 1874. Election in town hall 3d Tuesday in April. President is elected annually; three trustees elected each year for a term of two years. Is situated on the the O & M R R and on the branch of L & N R R; nearest banking point Belleville, the county seat; has about 1100 population; flour mill, etc, W U Tel, Adams Ex; B McGeehon, postmaster.

Inspired by the winter months, O'Fallon Historical Society member Maurice Hesse took on the monumental task of reorganizing the Historical Society Museum.
